Welcome Speech / Keynote

(15 minutes)

Dr. Mazi Shirvani is the interim Vice President, Academic at the University Canada West, Vancouver, BC. The distinguished mathematician completed both his BSc and PhD degrees at Queen Mary University of London. Following his doctoral studies, he embarked on a postdoctoral fellowship before joining the General Electric Co. of Britain's Advanced Research Lab from 1985 to 1987, working on neural networks and associative memories. In 1987, Dr. Shirvani moved to work in academia, joining the Department of Mathematics at the University of Alberta. Over three decades, he dedicated himself to teaching, research and administrative work, including significant labour relations duties. He retired as an emeritus professor in December 2018. Throughout his tenure, he served in various leadership roles, including Vice-Provost and Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research from 2008 to 2015, and chair of the Board of Trustees of the Universities Academic Pension Plan from 2007 to 2009.

Technical Speaker 1: The Convergence of Intelligence: AI and Cybersecurity (35 minutes)

Technical Speaker 3: Advancements in Healthcare Technology

(20 minutes)

Dr. Greg Anderson is the Interim Dean of the School of Nursing and Professor at Thompson Rivers University, Canada. An accomplished academic leader, educator, and researcher, he previously served as Dean of the Faculty of Science, where he led significant growth in academic programs, research, and student enrolment. Trained in exercise and occupational physiology, Dr. Anderson's research focuses on occupational health, resilience, physiological stress, and the physical and mental well-being of public safety personnel and frontline healthcare professionals. He is a founding member of the Canadian Institute for Public Safety Research and Treatment (CIPSRT) and has secured nearly \$50 million in research funding while authoring more than 100 peer-reviewed publications. His research has contributed to the development of evidence-informed practices, policies, and programs that improve the health and resilience of public safety organizations across Canada. As Interim Dean of the School of Nursing, Dr. Anderson continues to advance interdisciplinary health education, research, and innovation while fostering collaboration between academia, healthcare, and community partners.

Dr. Vivekanandan (Vivek) Kumar is the Acting Dean of the Faculty of Science and Professor of Computing Science at Thompson Rivers University, Canada. He is internationally recognized for his research in Artificial Intelligence in Education (AIED), intelligent tutoring systems, cognitive agents, and educational technologies. He earned his Ph.D. in Computer Science from the University of Saskatchewan and has held academic positions in Canada, the United States, New Zealand, India, and Sri Lanka. Dr. Kumar has authored more than 175 peer-reviewed publications and secured research funding from agencies including NSERC, SSHRC, and CFI. An IEEE Senior Member, he is committed to advancing interdisciplinary research, innovation in science and computing education, and collaboration between academia, industry, and the community.

Speaker: Resilience Against AI Disinformation: Capabilities and Readiness in Canada's Security Sector (20 minutes)

Dr. Ghazanfar Latif is an Assistant Professor of Computing Science at Thompson Rivers University, Canada, and President of the Canadian Association for Artificial Intelligence and Future Studies (AAIFS), a non-profit connecting academia, industry, and policymakers. An IEEE Senior Member with over twelve years of research experience, he has published 90+ peer-reviewed papers in AI, machine learning, and computer vision, and holds 14 US patents. His research spans human-centred AI, including AI-generated content detection, information integrity, assistive technologies, and AI in education with over 110 research publications. He has been named to the Stanford/Elsevier World's Top 2% Scientists list (2024, 2025) and received a Gold Medal at the 49th International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva. He previously served as Acting Director of the Center for Artificial Intelligence at Prince Mohammad Bin Fahd University and serves on the editorial board of Springer's Discover Artificial Intelligence.
